# Warriors win division

## But fall short in game for title at Ripken Stadium

With the baseball regular season wrapping up, the Warriors were beaten in the UCBAC title game after winning a pair of tight games, and the Aberdeen boys won two and lost two.

On Wednesday night, Havre de Grace, after claiming the Susquehanna (lower) Division crown with a 10-2 record, took on the C. Milton Wright Mustangs, winners of the Chesapeake (upper) Division, at Ripken Stadium in Aberdeen for the UCBAC championship. The Warriors, undone by errors, the CMW defense, and the four-hit pitching of the Mustangs' Mike Rappazzo, lost the game 10-0.

Warrior starter Bobby Jakubac

lasted two innings and was charged with the loss. Jeremy Tabor pitched 1-1/3 innings of relief, before handing the ball to Jon Rogers who lasted 2-2/3 innings. Travis Coakley pitched the balance of the game for Havre de Grace.

The lone offensive spark for the Warriors came in the top half of the third when Nick Hancock and Donny Sherman rapped out back-to-back, one-out singles, the first Havre de Grace hits of the contest. The rally, however, was snuffed out by back-to-back fly-outs from Jakubac and David Jacobs.

The Warriors next hit came in the fifth inning when Zack Tabor smashed a fastball down the right-

field line, then was caught at second trying for a double.

Jakubac had the Warriors' final hit of the game, a single, in the sixth inning.

The game was halted in the Mustangs' half of the sixth inning due to the 10-run mercy rule.

On Monday, the Warriors knocked off the visiting Joppatowne squad, 4-3, in eight innings.

Rogers relieved Havre de Grace starter Jeremy Tabor in the fourth, and held the Mariners scoreless for the remainder of the game to earn the win. Rogers also drove in the game-winning run in the bottom of the eighth

Havre de Grace's Colyn Irvine was

2-for-4 with one RBI. Sherman got his lone hit of the night in the eighth inning, stole second base, and scored the winning run on Rogers' single.

Last Friday night, the Warriors slipped past Edgewood 8-7 in eight innings.

Rogers was the winning pitcher, hurling the final 5-2/3 innings for Havre de Grace. Jakubac started for the Warriors and made it 2-1/3 innings for a no decision.

Offensively, the Warriors were led by Jeremy Tabor, who went 4-for-5, scored two runs, and drove in two runs, including the game-winner in the bottom of the eighth inning. Zack Tabor was 2-for-4 with a pair of runs and one RBI, while Travis

Coakley was 2-for-5 with a pair of singles. Rogers, Jakubac and Jacobs all recorded singles for the Warriors.

The Rams' Joe Harbach came through with a home run, two doubles and four runs to top Edgewood's offense.
